Last year, these programs helped more than 65,000 families in Wisconsin. The VITA program offers free tax help to people making \$50,000 or less who need help preparing their own income tax returns. TCE volunteers also specialize in helping taxpayers with questions pertaining to their investment and retirement accounts, pensions and insurance, and with unique tax issues that affect seniors.

These programs positively impact thousands of families each year, but only because volunteers donate their time, experience and expertise to these important programs. You don't have to be an expert to be a volunteer. Those who volunteer work with an experienced site coordinator who helps them complete the federal income tax law training through the IRS Link & Learn program, which can be found on the IRS website: https://www.linklearncertification.com/d/. Volunteers must also complete state income tax training, which is provided by individual site coordinators.

Throughout tax season, I have the opportunity to visit VITA and TCE sites across the state. I really enjoy talking with program volunteers.
